

HOW TO STAY CONNECTED WHILE DEPLOYED IN THE MIDDLE EAST

AT&T Calling Centers

AT&T has established Calling Centers at 41 U.S. Military camps in Afghanistan, Kuwait and Iraq. Eleven more are under construction. In these centers, military personnel can use AT&T Global PrePaid Cards, AT&T Military Calling Cards, or commercial credit cards to place calls. Collect calls can also be made. Specific, easy-to-understand information on how to call back to the U.S. or to another country can be found within the calling center.

AT&T Global PrePaid Cards



AT&T Global PrePaid Cards are available at your camp exchange. Cards purchased at the exchange in-country offer the best calling rates available, plus the convenience of being rechargeable. Recharging saves time—do it yourself or have someone at home do it for you. All that's needed is the 800 number and the PIN number from the back of your Card and a credit card.

Cards can also be purchased at vending machines, online and from the Military Exchange catalog. Cards purchased at non-military retail locations will work from the Middle East, but aren't as economical. For example, an AT&T PrePaid Phone Card bought at a retail store in the U.S. could deduct 18 units for a one-minute call back to the U.S. from Iraq, while an AT&T Exchange Card purchased in-country will deduct only 4 units for that same call.

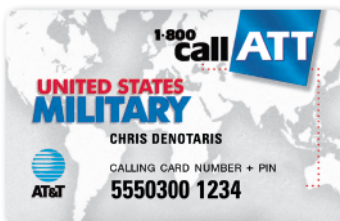
Customers can check the balance on any Card or determine the number of units that will be deducted per minute of calling time for an international call at the AT&T PrePaid Web site: www.consumer.att.com/prepaidcard. And remember, the next time you recharge your existing AT&T Global Prepaid Card, ask about AT&T Auto Minutes—it's the easy, hassle-free way to recharge your prepaid card.

Calling While Underway



On over 200 U.S. Navy ships and Coast Guard vessels equipped with AT&T Direct Ocean Service, you can use the AT&T-dedicated phones to call anyone ship-to-shore, almost anywhere in the world. To place a call while at sea:

- Use the special \$20 AT&T Global PrePaid Card shown here. This Card can be purchased at ship stores, vending machines, online or from the Military Exchange Catalog.
- Or use your AT&T Military Calling Card with the AT&T Global Military Saver Plus Plan.

No matter which card you use, the rate is the same: \$1.00 per minute*. Please note that AT&T PrePaid Cards purchased at non-military locations cannot be used onboard ships.

* A small number of ships, depending on the technology available, have rates based at either \$2.15 or \$2.95 per minute instead of \$1.00 per minute. The ship's command or Plan of the Day can provide you with specific rate information for your ship.

Credit Card and Collect Calls



Calls can be made with commercial credit cards or by calling collect. However, these methods of calling will be the most expensive and should only be used as a last resort. See chart for rates.

Satellite Phones

If your unit is travelling with a satellite phone that can receive calls, please note that calls placed by AT&T Residential customers in the U.S. to these phones incur a non-country specific rate of \$1.25 per minute of talk time. The cost of the call for the receiving party is subject to the terms and conditions of the customer's calling plan with the satellite phone provider.
